20 sel	<b>mmentary:</b> Human jealousy is a vice. But the Lord said, I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God (Exodus :5) "God's jealousy is love in action. He refuses to share the human heart with any rival, not because He is liftish and wants us all for Himself, but because He knows that upon that loyalty to Him depends our very oral life God is not jealous of us: He is jealous for us." (Redpath)

he he the no	<b>mmentary:</b> Apparently, these eminent apostles were men the Christians in Corinth admired, In Paul's y, the ability to speak in an eloquent and polished manner was popular. This is what Paul meant when said he is untrained' in speech. He also uses sarcasm when he refers to these men as 'eminent' because knew they were false teachers, and although he considered himself the chief of sinners and the least of e apostles (1 Timothy 1:15) he does not consider himself inferior to these false teachers. Paul asked for fee or anything in return for preaching the gospel to the Corinthians (v.7-10) false teachers demanded ge fees.
