Digging Deeper
Commentary: Letters [<i>Epistles</i>] of commendation [introduction]: Such letters were common and necessary in the early church. Unfortunately some false prophets would forge letters in order to deceive the believers by saying "Paul sent me, so you should support me." Paul wrote letters of introduction and would send them ahead or with the person who was going on behalf of Paul.
 Who did Paul write letters of introduction/commendation for? a. Rom 16:1-2
b. 2 Cor 8:16-24
c. Colossians 4:10
Commentary: The word 'trust' in verse 4 is "pepoithēsis"; in Greek, it means to put confidence and reliance in God through Christ. Paul was not boasting in his ability but in God's ability to use him the way He did. Our lives are not transformed because of a great sermon or any man, but by the Spirit of God. When you are a willing 'vessel' Jesus will do great things in and through you.
"Our sufficiency is of God; let us practically enjoy this truth. We are poor, leaking vessels, and the only way for us to keep full is to put our pitcher under the perpetual flow of boundless grace. Then, despite its leakage, the cup will always be full to the brim." Spurgeon ⁵

Commentary: "Paul contrasts the glory of the Ten Commandments with the glory of the life-giving Spirit." the law that leads to death was glorious, how much more glorious is God's plan to give us life through His Spirit!" ⁶ The old covenant had glory but how glorious is the new covenant of grace through Jesus Christ. Digging Deeper
Commentary: The background to verse 13 is Exodus 34:29-35 In verse 14 Paul writes that "their minds were blinded", that simply means they did not understand the true significance of what Moses was doing. Even at the time of Paul's writing the Jews still clung to the law and sacrifices to atone for their sins. "Paul makes a spiritual application of Moses' veil. He states that there is still a veil over the hearts of the Jews when they read the OT, and this veil keeps them from seeing Christ. The OT will always be a locked book to the heart that knows not Christ. Jesus removed that veil when He rent the veil of the temple and fulfilled the OT types and prophecies. Yet Israel does not recognize that the ministry of the Law is temporary; it is holding on to a ministry that was never meant to last, a ministry with fading glory." ⁷
