Theme:
Digging Deeper
<b>Commentary:</b> As we learned last week, we are ambassadors for Christ, and Paul pleaded with the Corinthians, and us, to be reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:20). Due to that reconciliation, we now have a new relationship with God and a true purpose for living. Our heart becomes a servant's heart and we work together with God. 1 Corinthians 3:9 says "For we are God's fellow workers" the Amplified Bible magnifies the verse this way:  "For we are fellow workmen (joint promoters, laborers together) with and for God."
Don't receive the grace of God in vain, my friend. God's grace should be making a difference in your heart and your life should shine bright with the love of Jesus for this dark world to see.

#### **Digging Deeper**

**Commentary:** Paul confidently states that He always considered his actions and how they might affect or reflect the ministry of the gospel. He did not ever want the ministry or Jesus to be viewed in a negative light. The conduct of an ambassador in the world's definition is to serve as the official representative of his or her own country. It is no different for the Christian, we are to serve as official representatives for Heaven- our real home 'country'.

Paul was careful to give no offense to anyone. Giving no offense means we are to live in such a way that no one can point to us and say "because of your poor example, because of your hypocrisy, I don't want anything to do with your faith or your God." Be an example, as Paul was, so others will look at you and say, 'Wow, you really have something special. I want and need what you have."

Paul's qualifications as a minister for God did not come from a seminary or from studying a bunch of theological books. No, his commendation came from life, from the experiences he had while living out his faith.

Regardless of what people thought of him Paul's attitude is something we all need to mimic. It did not matter to Paul whether he was honored or dishonored, whether people spoke evil or good of him; he didn't care that some saw him as a deceiver, or that he was not well known to people. (v8-10) Jesus made all the difference in Paul's world. It is only through Jesus and God's Holy Spirit that we can sorrow yet rejoice, be financially poor yet make others rich in spiritual things which are eternal. We can be physically dying, yet know we live eternally, and we may have little to no material goods and yet we know we really possess all things. The things that really matter most are a relationship with God, a Savior and friend in Jesus Christ and eternity in heaven.

Digging Deeper
<b>Commentary:</b> Paul's heart for the ministry was not only open but intense and passionate. Nelson's New Illustrated Bible Commentary <sup>13</sup> states that on only two other occasions did Paul address his readers specifically (Galatians 3:1 and Philippians 4:15). When he did this, as he did in verse 11 ('O Corinthians!" he was expressing strong emotion. He had been open and honest with the Christians in Corinth, but they had not received it well. He had written some harsh words to them in his first letter, but it was necessary They were in sin and, as any loving spiritual father would, he rebuked and corrected them. Some probabl accepted his rebuke and grew in the Lord, some obviously held it against him.
