full the kno of y wh Jor bed	Commentary: We don't know what sidetracked the Corinthian church but after 1 year they still had not fulfilled what their hearts were, at one time, eager to accomplish. To the best of our ability we should keep the commitments we have made to people but more importantly to God. As mentioned previously, He knows our needs and will be faithful, always. However, use wisdom in that you must provide for the needs of your family first. (1 Timothy 5:8). Paul was not asking that the believers burden themselves by giving when they don't have it to give. Jon Courson: Paul says to the Corinthians "even as the northern believers shared generously, so should you because you don't know when the situation will change unexpectedly. You don't know when you will need their help. This is a principle not only of finances but of life."

Digging Deeper
Commentary: Paul is making reference to the story found in Exodus 16:16-18. God had provided manna for the Israelites to eat, the only requirement He asked of them was to not gather more than was needed for the day, except for the day before Sabbath. On that day they were allowed to gather enough for two days, since they were not to work at all on the Sabbath day. God was instilling in them the ability to trust Him for everything, and to obey. The believers in Corinth were reminded by Paul that God has put them on Titus' heart to care for them just like they were on Paul's heart. God sends people like Paul and Titus into our lives to keep us on track or go us back on track when we get derailed from our commitments.

"S.O.A.P. stands for Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer.
