Digging Deeper

Commentary: What an amazing experience Paul had here in the first portion of chapter 12! The human imagination cannot father or words express what he saw and heard. Though he refers to himself in the third person, probably out of humility, it was Paul himself who was given the visions and revelations of the Lord. Bible commentators believe Paul experienced this event in Lystra after being stoned and left for dead. (Acts 14:19-20).

Recent authors have written about their out of body or near death experiences but we should always weigh those things against what God's word tells us and remember that where God is silent we too must be silent. Paul just wasn't sure if he was dead or alive he just knows what happened to him and had no words to fully express it.

If we are not careful we can become prideful and fed up- thinking we have accomplished great things in and of ourselves. verse 12 Paul is pointing out to the reader that these 'apostles' stressed and focused on the signs and onders and mighty deeds but Paul focused on teaching the Word of God. He, through the power of God, o performed miraculous deeds; but he did not boast about them. The greatest miracle we witness is the vation and transformation of a human soul.

Digging Deeper			
Commentary: If you are a parent or had loving parents you can relate to Paul's comment in verse 14, after all, children don't provide for their parents. Rather, parents provide for their children. Some of the Corinthians admitted that Paul was not a burden to them, but still, others thought him to be crafty and took advantage of them by trickery. But Paul poses the question to them- How did we take advantage of you? Give me examples? Titus was also faithful and loved them as Paul did, they shared the same passionate heart toward the Corinthians. We will never be able to please everyone all of the time, just keep walking in faith and loving others as God as called us to do.

Digging Deeper
Commentary: Because of the poor behavior of some believers the world has a cynical view of all believers They think we have a financial motive for everything or some political agenda, but the true follower of Christ does not have an ulterior motive, we simply, like Paul, want people to be built up in their faith and bless them.
The book of 2 Corinthians touches on matters of the heart, our hearts. Are we broken and mournful over the sin we see in our world today or have we become so desensitized to the violence and immorality that we simply walk in this world not being effective or affective in people's lives? Let that not be said of you.

3. What areas of sin did this church apparently have to deal with?

5. What did he reveal about his heart in Romans 9:1,2 in regard to his own countrymen?
