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Digging Deeper

"They are all adulterers"...the Lord says the king and royal princes were *entertained* by the wickedness of the people. They did not direct the people in the ways of the Lord, their own morality was hot, like an oven, inflamed with lustful passions. The corruption of the land included fraud, robbery, lies, wicked deeds, adultery and drunkenness.

Some of them seem to be entertained by the sin of the population and these leaders make provision for them to continue in their wickedness through the laws they enact, giving no voice or regard to those who seek to uphold godly moral standards.
