ver "str soj the	mmentary: The Apostle Peter's passion and concern for the Christians is clearly seen in these two rses. He reminds them, and us, we are only sojourners and pilgrims. In the original language it reads rangers and pilgrims". The word stranger (paroikos) means: one who lives on earth as a stranger, a ourner on the earth speaking of Christians whose home is in heaven". Peter addressed this letter to a Jewish believers, but most of us being Gentiles (v12) have the same purpose for being here, to bring ry to God's holy name to live our lives in such away that others will see Him in us.
